continued to improve training facilities for improving desired skills of the unemployed persons and ensure the availability of right kind of manpower to meet the emerging requirements of industries, service sector and agricultural sectors. Development of young persons is also an important priority of the Government.

- (xiii) Sustained efforts of the State in the area of governance reforms will continue to improve the quality of public service making public machinery more efficient, transparent and accountable. In this context, emphasis will be given on adoption of e-governance.
- (xiv) The fiscal reforms process will be continued to consolidate the gains and improve the resource base of the State government for greater investment in the development programmes.
- (xv) The sustained efforts of the State Government towards effective devolution of powers and responsibilities to the Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local Bodies and decentralization of planning process will be further strengthened.
